- 4. Richard Jeffries (BSG Co-Chair) presented the AGM presentation (**Paper 4**), including subcommittee updates. Items to note include:

- 5. Update from ESPL Editor (Prof Stuart Lane)

A presentation (summarised in **Paper 5**) on ESPL was given. The focus was on the relationship between the BSG and Wiley. At the end of the presentation, the following was emphasized:

- BSG should prepare for possible financial changes arising from changes associated with the ESPL Open Access model and a future BSG-Wiley contract
- Cuchlaine King Symposium themes will be chosen by the local BSG Annual Meeting organising committee and will aim to result in an ESPL Special Issue
- BSG members are encouraged to propose ESPL Special Issues

One question from the membership on the graph showing the global distribution of authors submitting manuscripts was answered.

6. New chair

Louise Callard introduced herself to members. She thanked Richard Jeffries and Katy Kemble for their leadership of the BSG over the last year, exemplified by the improvements to the BSG's website. Over the next year she envisages focusing upon:

- EDI
- Communications Strategy
- Ensuring that core functions of BSG operate effectively during the post-pandemic "business as normal" period
- Diversifying and strengthening the BSG's financial future

Louise Callard encouraged members to promote the geomorphological work that they undertake both to BSG members and wider society.

Discussion of statement of strategy and progression of the BSG (Brian Whalley)
